- Value for money via relationship-based contracting.






Procurement process

Standard process with a relationship specific components

• Select partners with effective communication, likely to build positive collaborative relationships.



Applying science to relationship evaluation

Three elements

- SELL Presentation
- Behavioural interview TELL
- Simulation exercise DO

Simulation exercise

 Simulation the working environment and measure the character of the team (Main Roads and Contractor) including attitudes, characters and behaviours.





Simulation exercise – Predictive validity


Past behaviour to indicate future performance

 Contractors (proponents) have been 'coached' to perform well, two methods applied to ensure predictive validity

- 1. Third quadrant of stress
- 2. Performance scores

A rigorous, quantitative, defensible method of including relationship evaluation in the procurement process

- New and innovative method of procurement to suit our strategic direction.
- Combines new and classical test theory from Industrial Organisational Psychology.
- Selection of contractors to work with Main Roads.
